I understand that this authorization will remain in effect until I cancel it in writing, and I agree to notify **St Patricks Church** in writing of any changes in my account information or termination of this authorization at least 15 days prior to the next billing date. If the above noted payment dates fall on a weekend or holiday, I understand that the payments may be executed on the next business day. For ACH debits to my checking/savings account, I understand that because these are electronic transactions, these funds may be withdrawn from my account as soon as the above noted periodic transaction dates. In the case of an ACH Transaction being rejected for Non Sufficient Funds (NSF) I understand that **St Patricks Church** may at its discretion attempt to process the charge again within 30 days, and agree to an additional **\$4.00** charge for each attempt returned NSF which will be initiated as a separate transaction from the authorized recurring payment. I acknowledge that the origination of ACH transactions to my account must comply with the provisions of U.S. law. I certify that I am an authorized user of this bank account and will not dispute these scheduled transactions with my bank; so long as the transactions correspond to the terms indicated in this authorization form.

3 Steps to Sacrificial Giving

There are some things we know we should do but we really struggle to do them. Things like driving the speed limit, eating broccoli, and cutting back on soda. All of these things would benefit us in some way, yet we often make excuses to get out of doing them. Giving is another of those areas we know we should do but we struggle to do it. Our excuses usually sound something like this:

“How do I know they are going to use my money the way I want them to?”

“All this church seems to care about is money.”

“I don’t understand what the Bible says about tithing so I don’t want to do it wrong.”

“I barely have enough to make ends meet right now, I can’t afford to give.”

We use these excuses to make ourselves feel better about not giving. Rather than continuing to make excuses, here are 3 steps you can take as you think about giving sacrificially:

1. Priority. Money always finds a way to spend itself. You must make giving non-negotiable or you will never have enough left over at the end of the month. When you are creating your budget, first decide what you are going to tithe and then base the rest of your budget around that.

“On the first day of every week, each of you is to put something aside and store it up, as he may prosper, so that there will be no collecting when I come.” 1 Corinthians 16:2 (ESV)

2. Percentage. Decide on what percentage you want to begin giving and stick with it. Don’t give up when it gets tough to give on a consistent basis. Giving sacrificially implies it won’t be easy, but it will be worth it.

“Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.” 2 Corinthians 9:7 (ESV)

3. Progressive. Challenge yourself every year to look at your budget and see if you can increase your giving. You can choose to go up a percentage or stop drinking soda and drive the speed limit and give that extra amount, this would help in more than one way.

“For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evils. It is through this craving that some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pangs.” 1 Timothy 6:10 (ESV)

Now is the perfect time to start giving. Don’t wait until everything is perfect or you will be waiting forever. Figure out what you can give for now and do that on a regular basis. It’s also important to find a method that is easy for you to use. St. Patrick’s offers online giving with recurring payments to help you stay consistent but can be changed at any time.

Don’t forget, “God loves a cheerful giver.” We have all been blessed with many riches and what a great way to be able to give back to the One who gave all.
